Electric School Bus State Snapshot

Indiana will soon have a fleet of 109 electric school buses (ESBs) transporting students in 26 school districts across the state. Eleven ESBs were funded by IDEM's Volkswagen Environmental Mitigation Trust, and one ESB at South Bend Community School Corporation was funded by the Indiana Michigan Power Company. Seventy-one ESBs were funded by grants and rebates from the US EPA Clean School Bus Program. The program is opening another round of funding this fall to which Indiana school districts can apply.

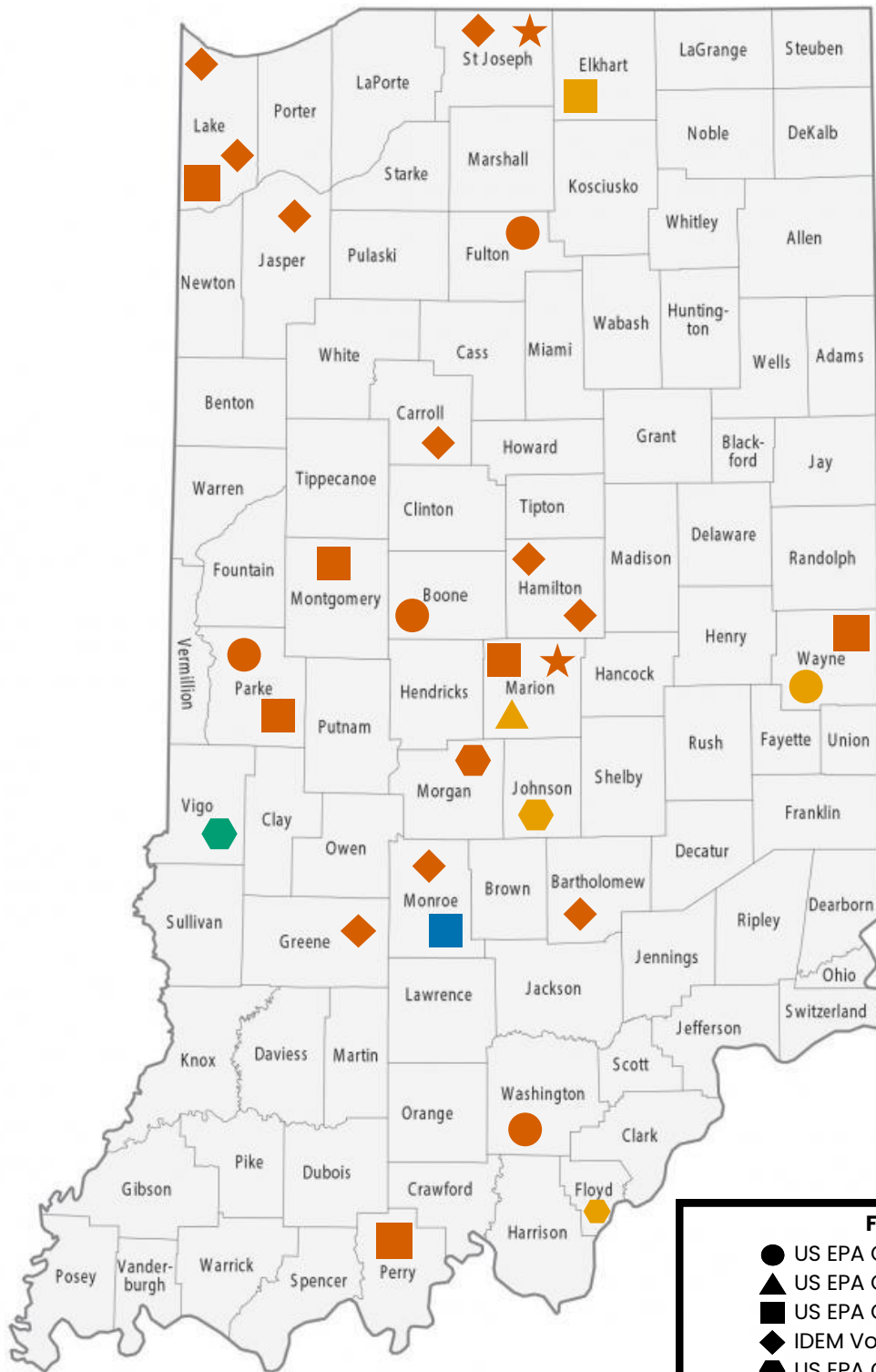


109 ESBs awarded to 26 schools
