



School Districts

Through various state and federal funding rounds, 63 school districts have been awarded electric school buses (ESBs), most of which are in priority counties and environmental justice communities.

Current Funding Opportunities

Current funding opportunities include the 2024 round of rebates through the EPA's Clean School Bus Program (CSBP) and the state's Clean Bus Energy Grant (CBEG) Program, which is collaboratively managed by Michigan's Departments of Education and Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy. Student and Community Health


In Michigan, about 850,000 students ride school buses, and around 137,400 children in the state have asthma, underscoring the importance of improving air quality by trasitioning to electric school buses. These zero-emission electric buses will help to protect children's health and vulnerable communities.
