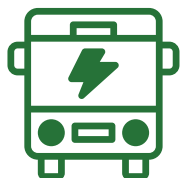


ELECTRIC SCHOOL BUSES: OHIO

Electric School Bus (ESB) State Snapshot

Ohio has been awarded 164 ESBs across 20 school districts across the state. 3 ESBs were funded by OEPA's Volkswagen Mitigation Grants. The rest of the ESBs were funded by the EPA's Clean School Bus Program. Ohio school districts are encouraged to apply for future funding opportunities.



“We’re estimated to save about \$47,000 a year between the two buses for maintenance and fuel cost. Essentially, whenever we did the analysis, a large portion of it was a financial decision.”

Ohio Electric School Buses

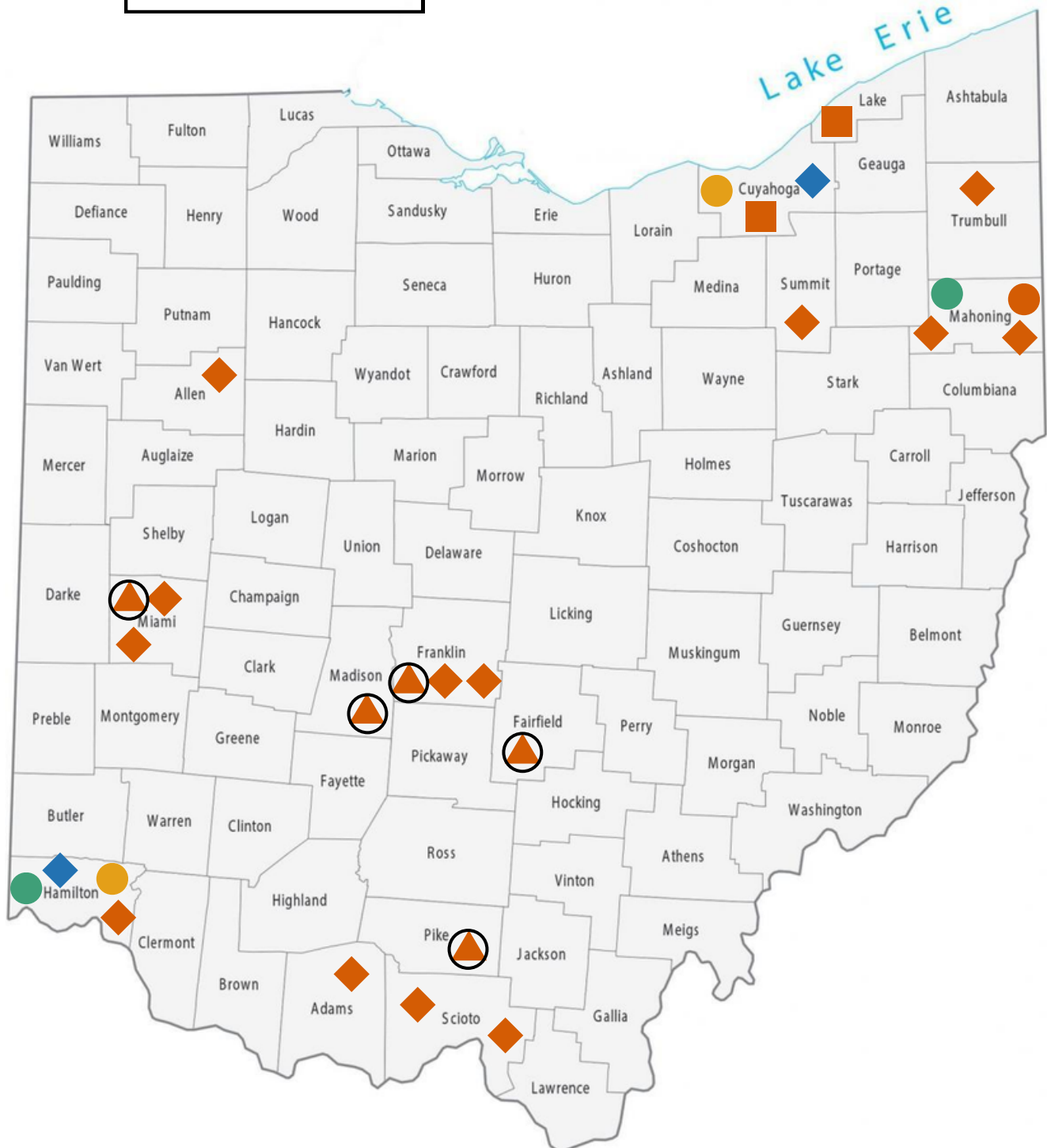
