Electric School Bus State Snapshot

A total of 135 electric school buses (ESBs) have been awarded to 28 school districts across the state, funded by the EPA's Clean School Bus Program. The 2024 Clean School Bus Rebate Program is NOW CLOSED. Wisconsin school districts are encouraged to apply for future fudning opportunities.





School buses make up the largest fleet of public transportation vehicles in the U.S., with 2.5x the number of vehicles of all other forms of mass transportation combined.



There is no safe level of diesel exhaust for children. The ATSDR reports that nitrogen oxides in diesel causes fatigue, irritability, headaches, and nausea, with worse effects in children with asthma.




